Every day:

- Reading

Weekly:

- **Reading:** please sign and date the reading diary to show that your child has read at home. All children who have at least 3 comments in their book across the week, will be entered into a Reading termly prize draw.
- **Times Tables:** please sign and date the reading diary to show that your child has practised the times tables through Times Tables Rockstars or another source. All children who have at least 3 comments in their book across the week, will be entered into a Maths termly prize draw.
- **Spellings:** the children will bring home spellings every Friday and will have a spelling test the following Friday. Spelling Frame (online) can be used for support.
- **Maths:** the children will bring home a weekly maths skill sheet that covers all areas of the maths curriculum. It will be sent home on a Friday and will be due in on a Thursday morning.

- Homework helps teachers determine how well the lessons are being understood by their students.
